

Examples of secondary purpose clauses

Μήδεια: τί δ' ὀμφαλὸν γῆς θεσπιωδὸν ἐστάλης; Αἰγεύς: παίδων ἐρευνῶν σπέρμ' ὅπως γένοιτό μοι.

Medea: Why did you go to the prophetic heart of the world?

Aegeus: For children: to find out how I could have them.

Euripides Medea 668-9

οὐ γὰρ δὴ οὕτω γε φρενοβλαβῆς ἦν ὁ Πρίαμος οὐδὲ οἱ ἄλλοι οἱ προσήκοντες αὐτῷ,
ὥστε τοῖσι σφετέροισι σώμασι καὶ τοῖσι τέκνοισι καὶ τῇ πόλι κινδυνεύειν ἐβούλοντο,
ὅκως Ἀλέξανδρος Ἑλένη συνοικέη.

*Priam was not so crazed - and nor were his companions - to want to put their own bodies,
children and the city at risk so that Paris could live with Helen.*
